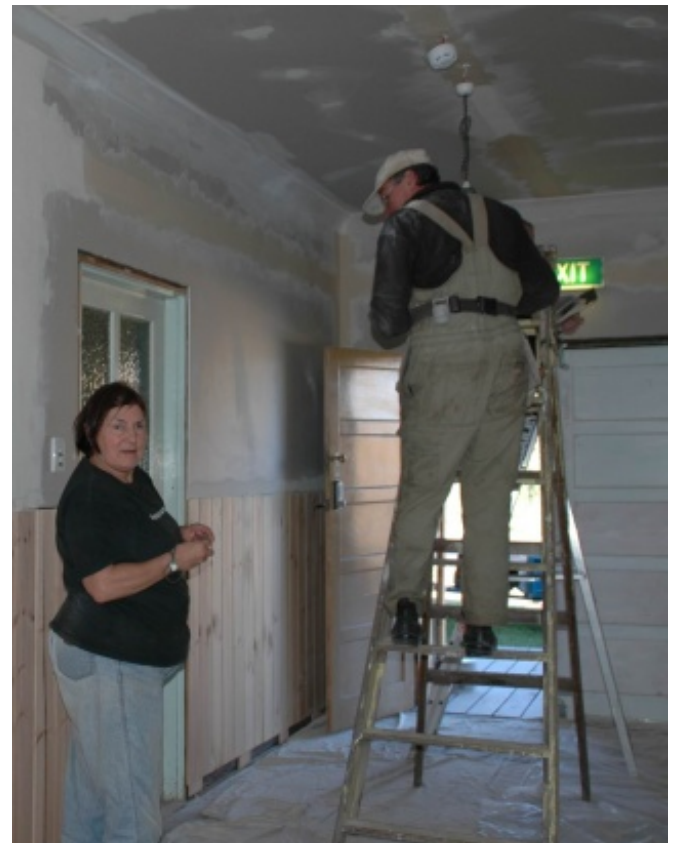

With the ceiling being so high up, it was always a problem trying to get up into the roof space. During the renovations the boys had put a great
